### **COVID SAFETY REMINDERS: Student Drop-off and Pick-up**

We continue to urge parents/families to exercise caution when dropping off or picking up children. When you are dropping off/picking up children, please keep physical distance (2 metres) in accordance with COVID-19 protocols and/or wear a mask. We would ask that you encourage students that are able, to walk independently to the lineup. If you are staying after school for your child to play on the playground, please keep distance and/or wear a mask. Adults without masks should not be in close proximity to other students. Thanks for helping to keep our school community as safe as possible. Because people are standing together for a period of time, we recommend parents/families wear masks to assist in keeping our school community healthy.

### **Homework for Absent Students**

During these unprecedented times, we understand that parents/guardians will make decisions in the best interest of their children and potentially keep children home (at different times throughout the year). Please understand that, at this point in time (Stage 2), we do not have the capacity for teachers to create two programs for students. Stage 2 dictates that schools are providing in class instruction. Students are welcome to use anything online set up by the classroom teacher (e.g. Teach Your Monster to Read, Prodigy, Mathletics, Google Classroom) and teachers will put aside work missed for parents to come and pick up if the parent would like to do this. Additional suggested educational activities for students who are absent might be:

- 1. Daily Reading discussing characters, main events and setting
- 2. Writing keep a journal about daily events in their life and/or summarize/respond to text that's been read or watched
- 3. Math play math games (cards, board games, dice games

# ASK YOURSELF THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS

- Is my child new to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?
- Do I have a child turning five years old on or before December 31, 2021 entering Kindergarten? Applications must be received by June 15, 2021 to ensure a placement in your child's catchment-area school.
- Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion? Late French Immersion Students are placed as space permits.
- Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? Applications will be received until January 31, 2021, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2021.
- Do I want to register my child in secondary academies?

Strong Start Program: Strong Start is a school-based, free program for amilies with young children (aged birth to five). This provincial program is in place to help prepare children for success in Kindergarten. Children are registered into the program. Qualified early childhood educators lead learning activities where children learn through PLAY, promoting social, emotional, physical, cognitive and early literacy development in each child. ### ON GOING COMMUNICATION OF STUDENT LEARNING:

In Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools, we have moved from a model of 'reporting to parents' to 'communicating student learning with parents' on an ongoing basis. We work towards providing families/ caregivers with timely and responsive communication of student learning throughout the year, following district policies and procedures.

In addition to two written reports (Feb & June), you will receive communication from your child's teacher a minimum of three times throughout the year (recent parent teacher conference counts as one instance). This ongoing communication may come to you by way of a work sample being sent home, a classroom showcase of learning or a Freshgrade communication for those teachers utilizing the program. There are minimum requirements for instances of ongoing communication of student learning:

# Explicitly references the Learning **Standards**

Learning standards include the Curricular Competencies and Content as identified in the new BC Curriculum documents. They describe what the students are expected to know, understand, and be able to do.

# Includes Authentic Evidence of Learning

Student created evidence. Examples may be: student work samples, photographs, audio, and video offer visible, authentic evidence of learning. These may be observed at any time during the learning process.

### Provides Descriptive Feedback

Descriptive feedback is ongoing, specific and timely. The primary purpose of descriptive feedback is to help the student understand:

- What they are doing well
- What needs improvement
- What are the next steps for learning

## Includes Student Voice

Ownership of learning becomes more authentic when students use their own voice to communicate about their learning. Student voice is when the student can self-reflect and articulate what they are learning, why they are learning it and identify where they are in the learning process.

There are also minimum numbers of communications by curricular areas required: Language Arts 3, Math 3, Science 2 and Social Studies 2. Teachers are required to keep a record of their Ongoing communications with parents throughout the year, which will be attached to students' written reports.

## **SCHOOL CLOSURES DUE TO WEATHER:**

It is that time of year again, when the school district would like to remind parents about school closure procedures. The most common reasons that schools might be closed are dangerous road conditions due to a heavy snowfall or ice, or long-term power outage.

If you are wondering if schools are open on a particular day, for the most current updates listen to local radio stations (WAVE 102.3 FM and WOLF 106.9 FM) in the mornings.

We also attempt to put an announcement of any school closure on the school district website, <a href="www.sd68.bc.ca">www.sd68.bc.ca</a>, and on Twitter and Facebook, but our ability to do so could be affected by such things as power outages and technical issues. If there is no announcement on the website or social media, please be sure to listen to local radio stations.

We would like to remind parents that it is their right to make the final decision as to whether it is safe for their children to travel to school on any given day. While the district strives to make the best decision possible for students across the district, there may be circumstances in your neighbourhood that lead you to decide to keep your children home, even though schools are open.
