# HALLOWEEN AT GEORGIA AVENUE:

We will not be holding our annual costume parade this year but we will welcome costumes at school this coming Friday. If students do not want to wear a costume dressing in orange & black is encouraged. Regarding costumes, please refrain from excessive gore/blood (disturbing to some students) and replica weapons (guns, swords, daggers etc..). We prefer face make-up over masks as when we can't see faces, it is a security issue. If your child chooses to wear a costume, please make sure that they arrive wearing it and intending to keep it on all day. With washrooms being one at a time, we do not want to place extra demands on them if we have students changing here at school. Also just a reminder that our COVID Guidelines prohibit home-made items being sent to school as well as students sharing food items. Do not send packaged treats for student to distribute at school (COVID guidelines: results in increased multiple hand contacts)

## HAVE A SAFE HALLOWEEN:

We would normally have a school assembly (supported by our Liaison officer), regarding Halloween safety. This year our staff will give some safety reminders that we hope you will be reinforcing at home.

- Be visible—carry a flashlight/glow stick don't dress in all black (consider some reflective wear). Stay on the sidewalk
- Choose a bright, comfortable costume you can see well in. Stay away from long trailing fabric.
- Only go to houses that have at least one light on.
- Have an adult inspect your candy prior to consuming. Don't eat unwrapped candy.
- Stay away from crowds and clustering—follow safe distance rules—Trick-or-treat locally
- Avoid indoor events.

# COVID SAFETY REMINDERS: Student Drop-off and Pick-up

A reminder that students are encouraged to arrive at school as close to 8:45am as possible and to go directly to their class line-up areas. Parents who accompany their child onto the school grounds must keep walkways clear and maintain physical distance from other students. Please refrain from going close to classroom doors. If you need to talk with the teacher, please either write a note indicating this in the students planner or wait until the class has entered the classroom instead of crowding the exterior door. Thank you for your attention to this.

# HOWARD AVE. SAFETY:

We would like to strongly encourage you to drop your children off on Georgia Ave. (front of school), instead of Howard Avenue. There have been many complaints from neighbours of parents blocking driveways. Additionally, parents are stopping in areas marked as no parking/stopping and their vehicles are obstructing pedestrian and other drivers' view of the crosswalk and areas our students need to be seen. Our Liaison officers and Nanaimo Bylaw inform us that there are fines for both stopping in a no stopping zone and for obstructing traffic. **An improvement in this area is much needed for the sake of our students' safety**. We have been working with the City of Nanaimo to study this area, it's issues and come up with some improvements/solutions. A local speed awareness group will be spending some time monitoring this area as well.
